The State Unemployment Office will extend benefits to workers who are sick, quarantined or taking care of family members who are ill. First responders in the public health community who became ill or quarantined due to exposure are also eligible. Self-employed workers and independent contractors who don't have access to

Michigan Artist Relief Fund to help provide funds for music industry workers who have lost income for the next 3 months (some cases further out) because of event cancellations or venues closing. We take applications on Friday and you can find all if the info, from the requirements to apply and opportunities for those who want to give at this link.

Childcare for Essential Employees is Coming: Gov. Whittmer just announced that the state is going to be offering pop up childcare centers to give essential workers a place to take their children if their current child care provider closes. The list would include but not be limited to medical professionals, police and fire department employees, at least some government employees, and sanitation workers. City of GR Responding to Coronavirus: The following changes are in effect starting Wednesday, March 18 through 11:59 p.m. Sunday, April 5: A comprehensive list of what's open and closed can be found here

- City Hall, Grand Rapids Development Center, Parks and Recreation and Public Works, Water Resource Recovery Facility, Water Administration Building, and Mobile GR-Parking Services Department are closed to walk-in traffic. The city said staff members will be available to provide services via email, phone or 311 Customer Service.
- Water service shutoffs are suspended through April 30 and accounts in shutoff status are to be restored.
- Interior inspections of occupied residential units for code enforcement, water services and lead remediation projects are suspended except in the case of an emergency health, safety or welfare concern.
- Cemetery services are limited to 50 people per Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's executive order.
- Police, water, fire, trash and more are still open. Click the link above for more info.
